

Number of Latino Immigrants and Non-Immigrants in Virginia




Latino Share of Virginia's Population Growth, 2007 to 2013


Countries of Birth for Virginia Immigrants from Latin America


Share of foreign-born and native-born Latino Virginians by age

Most Virginia Adults Work


Share of Virginians age 16+ who are working

Latino Immigrants Work in Virginia's Major Industries


Share of Latino native-born and foreign-born employment in Virginia

Share of households in Virginia by income




High Share of Income Going to Housing


Housing Costs are a Challenge for Latino Immigrants

Households Headed by Latino Immigrants




All Virginia Households
